

# **Powel, Samuel School**

The District-Wide Survey is one of SDP's best tools for assessing different perspectives across topics. The surveys collect feedback from parents, students, and teachers. Most survey questions relate to one of six topics important to school improvement: Climate, Instruction, Leadership, Professional Capacity, Parent/Guardian-Community Ties, or Equity and Inclusion. The more positive the feedback received, the higher the score for each topic. The highest possible score is 10.

#### Sample question:

How often is this statement true? "I enjoy being in school."




## **Survey Participation**

### **Feedback Trends Over Time**


How to read this figure: The points on the chart show the average score for each topic every year. The topics are colorcoded according to the key at right. Upward movement shows more positive responses while downward movement shows less positive responses. If a topic or topics have missing scores, it typically means that there was a low response rate or missing data from at least one group.
