# Constitution High School

The School District of Philadelphia is committed to continued implementation of the Accelerate Philly Strategic Plan, including ongoing investments in schools as the primary unit of change. These investments address all of the Accelerate Philly priority areas: Improving Safety and Well-Being; Partnering with Families and Community; Accelerating Academic Achievement; Recruiting and Retaining Diverse and Highly Effective Educators; and Delivering Efficient, High Quality, Cost-Effective Operations.

Through centralized fiscal responsibility measures, the District was able to maintain overall budget and positions in School Year 2025-26, even following the September 2024 end of Federal COVID-19 relief funding.

Data excludes facilities, transportation, food services, psychologists, school safety, teacher residents, and centrally-managed supports for schools.
