The School District of Philadelphia is committed to continued implementation of the *Accelerate Philly* Strategic Plan, including ongoing investments in schools as the primary unit of change. These investments address all of the *Accelerate Philly* priority areas: Improving Safety and Well-Being; Partnering with Families and Community; Accelerating Academic Achievement; Recruiting and Retaining Diverse and Highly Effective Educators; and Delivering Efficient, High Quality, Cost-Effective Operations.

The District is committed to moving from a structural deficit to long-term fiscal sustainability, with a goal of fully closing the budget gap by FY30. Achieving this requires measured reductions across both central office and school budgets beginning in FY27.

Data excludes facilities, transportation, food services, psychologists, school safety, teacher residents, and centrally-managed supports for schools.
